The Isaksimagit Inuusirmi Katujjiqatigiit Embrace Life Council (IIKELC) is happy to announce that this year's Mental Health Art Contest is now open, starting **September 11, 2023.**The Mental Health Art Contest is an annual contest for **Nunavut residents** to create art that is meaningful to themselves, to others, and that inspires wellness in our communities.

Theme

The theme for the 2023 Mental Health Art Contest is **Memories**. This can be approached in many creative ways.

Here are some ideas that could inspire you, but please do not limit yourself!

- Your most memorable moments
- Remembering the lives of our loved ones
- Ways in which you remember a loved one
- A time when you felt inspired

Artists Invited to Participate

Children ages: 10-13
Youth ages: 14-18, and
Adults ages: 19 and over.

Art Mediums

Submissions will be accepted in multiple languages including Inuktitut, Inuinnaqtun, French, and English. Many different forms of 2D art submissions will be accepted such as:

Drawing

Painting

Watercolour

Original stencil art

Linocut / printmaking

Collage

Size & Finishing

Horizontal or vertical art must be approximately 8.5" x 11".

Avoid writing the artist's name on the actual submission – this information is included on the Entrant Form.

Judging Criteria

Artists' interpretation and ability to visually communicate the theme of memories will be considered in the judging process, as well as creativity, technical skills and craftsmanship. A panel of 4 judges with expertise in arts and/or mental health will select the winning entries.

If desired, artists may submit up to three (3) of their original artwork in the contest. Each individual art piece that is submitted must have its own completed Art Entry Form.

All entrants must complete the attached Media Release Form and Art Entry Form. Entrants under 18 years of age must have the Media Release Form completed by their parent or guardian.

We cannot accept art that features a trademarked logo or features individuals other than the artist. Art that does not follow these instructions will be disqualified.
